They are not the only ones. Thousands of students in Iran are today barred from higher education for speaking out on such issues as women's rights, academic freedom, human rights and the rights of prisoners.

Since 1991, Iran has been carrying out a systematic policy to treat Bahá'ís in such a way that "their progress and development will be blocked." Bahá'ís "must be expelled from universities," and denied "any position of influence, such as in the educational sector..."
